

# FIVE-CENTS-A-MEAL ANNUAL REPORT - 2009

**Adult Care and Share Center, Charlotte**.....\$5,790  
Senior day care center providing nutritious food and safe haven for low income persons.

**Anson County Crisis Ministry**.....\$730  
Providing food to families in crisis in the Anson County area.

**Bethlehem Center, Charlotte**.....\$14,500  
Southside community center offers youth programs, senior citizen activities, and drug and alcohol rehabilitation. Grant provides hot lunches and nutritious after school snacks.

**Biscoe Food Pantry, (MCCA)**.....\$3,630  
Ecumenical emergency food pantry operated by the various churches and youth groups in Biscoe, serving the needs of the hungry in eastern Montgomery County.

**Blessed Assurance Adult Care**.....\$3,630  
Provides nutritional meals to senior and special population adults, and life enhancing programs and services designed to promote their independence.

**Cabarrus Meals on Wheels, Concord**.....\$3,630  
A home-delivered lunch program providing food for low income participants.

**Charlotte Emergency Housing (Plaza Place)**.....\$2,900  
Provides meals for homeless families and single women in this transitional shelter. Also stocks pantries for families when they leave.

**Charlotte Rescue Mission**.....\$3,270  
This grant went to help feed men who are enrolled in the Rebound program for Alcohol and Drug Rehabilitation.

**Common Ground Outreach Ministry**.....\$440  
Located in the Bent Oaks Community in Charlotte, the grant helps buy food for the After-School care program.

**Communities in Schools, Montgomery Co**.....\$4,330  
Provides food thru Backpack Pals program for selected elementary school children in county who are participating in the free or reduced b'fast and lunch programs to provide nutrition to these student on weekends when they cannot access the lunch program at school.

**Community Culinary School**.....\$1,090  
Provides training and job placement in the food service industry for people who are chronically unemployed.

**Cooperative Christian Ministry (Cabarrus)**.....\$7,300  
Emergency food pantry, soup kitchen and crisis ministry serving the Concord and Kannapolis area.

**Crisis Assistance Ministry, Charlotte**.....\$18,260  
Central crisis response agency for Mecklenburg County, providing food on an emergency basis.

**CUP Ministries (Christians United for People)**.....\$3,500  
Emergency food and clothing ministry serving the urban poor in North Charlotte.

**Double Oaks Nursery**.....\$610  
Pre-school and after-school daycare for young children in the central Charlotte area including Statesville Avenue and North Graham Street corridors.

**Friendship Trays, Charlotte**.....\$16,210  
Seven day a week home lunch delivery. Grant provides for low income recipients.

**Helping Hands, Richmond County**.....\$5,060  
Provides food through Backpack Pals program with the purpose of feeding the children on weekends during the school year.

**Korean Senior Center**.....\$2,890  
Providing meals to Korean senior citizens in a fellowship setting.

**Lakewood Preschool Co-op**.....\$2,160  
Cooperative effort among parents, children, and staff, for children in Lakewood. (Breakfast and snacks)

**Loaves & Fishes, Inc**.....\$8,730  
Provides groceries to people in crisis. Clients are referred by human services agencies or ministries in the Mecklenburg County area.

**Loaves & Fishes, Union**.....\$2,180  
Distributes food on an emergency basis, reaching the needy in Union County through a referral process.

**Loving Care Adult Day Care**.....\$5,820

**Loving Touch Adult Day Care**.....\$10,890  
*(See Adult Care and Share)*

**MCCA Meals On Wheels**.....\$3,630  
(Montgomery County Churches in Action)  
*(See Cabarrus Meals on Wheels)*

**Mt. Gilead Food Bank**.....\$3,630  
Church in Mt. Gilead area providing food of nutritional value to local poor and those who need help supplementing their groceries.

**Mt. Pleasant Food Ministry (Cabarrus)**.....\$1,090  
Provides groceries for families in need located in the Mt. Pleasant School District

**Neighborhood Good Samaritan**.....\$1,820  
A new food pantry reaching out to the African immigrant population within the Charlotte area.

**New Friends Adult Day Care**.....\$9,840  
*(See Adult Care and Share)*

**Operation Breadbasket (Concord)**.....\$1,460  
This is a small, but very busy food pantry.

**Operation Reach-out, Monroe**.....\$7,940  
Ecumenical emergency food pantry serving Union County.

**PALS (Adult Care and Share)**.....\$5,800  
This Senior day care center, located at two sites, provides a safe and productive environment for older adults. The grant helps pay for a hot lunch and two healthy snacks.

**Restoration House Ministries**.....\$2,190  
A Homeless and Rehabilitation ministry serving in Monroe.

**Richmond County Mental Health**.....\$5,800  
Providing funds for two soup kitchens, emergency food boxes and homeless shelter serving that area's needy.

**Robinson Breadbasket**.....\$1,500  
New food pantry serving free meals to the nearby community on a monthly basis.

**Salvation Army Concord Food Pantry**.....\$3,610  
Providing food baskets to clients through the Concord Corps Food Pantry.

**Samaritan House, Charlotte**.....\$3,610  
Providing three meals per day in a recuperative care home setting providing respite care for homeless individuals when they are discharged from the hospital.

**Samaritan Station**.....\$2,090  
A food pantry located in Covenant Church, Kannapolis—providing emergency food needs

**Second Harvest**.....\$3,630  
Solicits and distributes food and other grocery products through partner agencies and educates the community about the nature and solutions of hunger.

**Seigle Avenue Preschool Co-op**.....\$1,010  
*(See Lakewood Preschool Co-op)*

**Seigle Avenue Partners**.....\$1,080  
Provides meals that allow for building hope into the lives of children and their families who live in the Belmont Community.

**Society of St. Andrew (gleaning)**.....\$5,100  
Food rescue and distribution agency, specializing in gleaning projects.

**Stanly Cty Christian Ministry, Albemarle**.....\$5,450  
Ecumenical crisis response agency with a food pantry.

**TAPS**.....\$730  
(Dolly Tate—Teen Age Parents Service, Charlotte)  
Purchases food for pregnant teenage students, to eat during break times. Food is prepared by Home Economics Class.

**Tri-Language Haitian Church**.....\$250  
Providing emergency funding for feeding families of single moms, single folks, congregation and community to meet the need of those who are hungry.

**Union County Community Shelter**.....\$6,490  
Soup Kitchen providing dinners for the homeless.

**University Adult Day Care**.....\$7,050  
*(See Adult Care and Share)*

**Uptown Shelter, Charlotte**.....\$10,810  
Transition shelter that provides meals for homeless men.

**Urban Ministries-St. Peter's Soup Kitchen**...\$10,810  
Daily lunches for the hungry in Charlotte's inner city.

**West Boulevard Senior Alliance**.....\$2,950  
Provides meals for monthly luncheon meetings—purpose of program is to meet needs of older adults in the West Boulevard community and beyond.
